
September to December Courses

Learn about and experience the process of "How to Set Up a Simple Weaving Project," and see if this is a craft that you might enjoy. Students may use our table looms or bring their own table or rigid heddle loom to class. Students wishing to use our looms will learn about the process of preparing the loom before weaving on a prepared loom to make a 3-4" wide bookmark or art treasure in this workshop. Students who bring their own looms will set them up in class for completion at home (using the instructor's pre-made warp). All participants will learn different methods, patterns and finishing tips. The instructor will contact students prior to class to discuss plans. Beginners and those with some experience can repeat this class for continued learning opportunities.

Weaving Studios

Weaving Studios offer an opportunity for an extended experience in weaving. Instructors serve as mentors, guiding weavers to explore more complex skills and concepts. Students design projects of their own choosing in order to expand knowledge of methods and techniques. Beginning weavers are welcome to join a studio.

For each day and time, two 7 to 9 week sessions run consecutively in each semester. Cost is \$178 to \$223 per session depending on session length.

To be admitted to a Weaving Studio, join the waitlist (class number 25300) via our online registration system. Waitlisted students will be informed of openings in Studios on a first come, first served basis. You will remain on the waitlist until you are placed in a Studio or you request to be removed from the waitlist. It may take some time to be admitted to a Studio because the Center has a limited number of dedicated studio looms available. In the meantime, to expand your weaving experience, we encourage you to participate in any of our weaving workshops, or to suggest classes in specific structures or techniques you'd like to learn.

Explore with Fiberworks

Fiberworks is one of those tools that once you use it you wonder how you ever got along without it. The software enables you to enlarge the draft, check the floats, find out if there are mistakes in the source, play with the colors, rearrange the tie-up, make up your own treadlings, compose notes, and print the draft, colors, notes, and number of threads needed for each repeat. And those are only some of the vast possibilities as you further explore! Students will come to class with a version of Fiberworks downloaded on their computers, either the paid or the free demo. The instructor will contact students before the class for specific questions. AGE: Adults

Pin loom weaving involves weaving yarn around pins on a hand-held, portable loom. The technique allows for experimentation with colors and patterns to create unique pieces. Pin Loom Weaving is easy to learn and relaxing. The looms are compact, come in various shapes and sizes and are easy to carry, making it a great craft for travel or on the go. Woven squares can be used to create a variety of items such as mug rugs and coasters, keychains, bags, blankets and shawls, cute little critters and more! We will start out with mug rugs and if time allows, try a pin cushion or sachet pillow.

Students will need a device that allows full participation in a zoom meeting and will need to download the Zoom App (Zoom 5.0) to their device and know the basics of how to use it. Students will need to take photos of their work in .jpg format and upload them to a site (such as Google Drive or One Drive) that the teacher sets up for that purpose.

NOTE: The instructor will notify students of a rehearsal time prior to the workshop for all to learn how to use Zoom effectively for the workshop and will send class notes electronically prior to the start of class.

Designing with Friends of Fibonacci ZOOM Class

Many designers, weavers included, know about and work with that seemingly no-fail number sequence that is part of the Fibonacci legacy. That sequence, however, is far from the only system from the realm of science and mathematics that offers a weaver a rich source of ideas about how many colors, threads, shafts, blocks, repeats, even ends per dent to use in their textiles. The really great news is that just as you may not know how to build a computer to use one with confidence, you don't have to understand the golden mean. Pascal's triangle or Alcuin's Sequence in order to use the numbers they generate. And, though number geeks are not excluded from this class, if you can count as high as the number of shafts on your loom and do basic warp calculations, you are indeed expert enough to put class concepts to work for you. Most class examples will be couched in weaver's terms, but quilters and others will find the ideas equally applicable to their work.

Exploring Woven Optical Illusions ZOOM Class

Enter a world where a flat surface tricks you into seeing columns and pleats; where shapes approach you then retreat, where you need a straight edge to be convinced the lines are not curving. That's the world of optical illusions—and it's right here on your loom! Classes will blend teacher presentations with student discussion and brain-storming as you discover many ways that weaving techniques can celebrate the fun and mysteries of visual illusions. Homework will focus on planning and design and, though not "required," the weaving of at least one project is strongly encouraged.

In this workshop at The Center participants will learn the basics of rep weave and some of its variations. Students will each be given a different rep weave draft in advance to dress their loom for class. We will start with classic rep treadling, then move into treadling variations, and finally throw out the rule book altogether and see what happens. All the drafts used in class will be made available to everyone in class. People are encouraged to walk around and see what others are doing and take photos to go with those drafts. Tapestry Weaving

Tapestry 101: The Woven Image

Using a simple loom and beautiful yarns, try your hand at the ancient techniques of tapestry weaving to create an image in woven cloth. The word "tapestry" means something quite specific to a weaver...a design or image woven directly into the cloth using some specialized techniques to create lines and shapes, designs and pictures. Your hands are the tools that weave together strong warps with brightly colored wefts. A small, prepared, portable loom will be provided so you can begin weaving at our first class. You'll try a series of techniques to create a small sampler of color and methods. Then you are ready to move on to begin a design of your own, putting those techniques into practice. Small portable looms will be provided, and are available for purchase for an additional \$15.

You've heard about "long draw" vs. "short draw," about "combing" vs. "carding" fiber, "woolen" vs. "worsted" spinning—but you'd really like to have someone show you how they differ, how they're done, and what it means for you and your yarn! Bring a spinning wheel in good working condition, along with fiber about which you have questions regarding best use. If you have them, bring wool combs and/or hand cards. An up-to-date tetanus booster is a good idea when working with wool combs. Come learn what a difference combing and carding can make, and expand your fiber skill set!

Everlasting Socks with Replaceable Soles

You love knitting socks, but—darn it!—they eventually spring holes, and those holes are almost always located somewhere on the bottom of the socks, where the foot meets the floor (or perhaps the shoe), and it always seems that these holes never appear in the same place twice! Wouldn't it be lovely if you could retain the entire "public" part of your handknit socks and simply "magic" an entirely new sole into place? It's possible to do this, using Marcia's elegant "unvention": a fully replaceable, "everlasting" sole! Bring smooth, worsted-weight yarn and a circular needle at least 30" long in an appropriate diameter (size 4-7). We'll work a small sample sock in class to master the technique, and you'll receive a pattern for adult socks worked in fingering-weight varn. We'll also discuss how to convert this technique for use with any other sock pattern you like!

Did you know that crochet CANNOT be worked by a machine? Come learn the easy skills needed to make a basic chain stitch and form single- and double-crochet stitches. We'll explore reading patterns and graphs, and you'll be on your way to creating the handcrafted work of your dreams: baskets, blankets, mittens, hats and shawls! Bring a skein of smooth, worsted-weight yarn (ideally variegated, ideally wool), and any crochet hook size F to I.

Dragon Scale Crochet

Dragon Scale crochet—also called "Crocodile stitch"—is a highly-textured crochet stitch resembling feathers! This enticing texture is created by developing an underlying structure, much like lace, before working additional stitches into the lace layers below. In this manner, one can develop intriguing items ranging from cup koozies to mermaid's tails, from cowls to mitts to toys to tank tops! We'll work on an easy project in class, to master the simple skills required, and explore the myriad other patterns available online and in print—as well as how to develop our own! Basic skills required (chain st, single and double crochet); bring a crochet hook in size F or G and some worsted-weight yarn, plus an adventurous spirit! *There may be dragons!!*

DYEING

These dye classes require the use of personal protective equipment. Students are required to provide their own N95 or KN95 respirator. Students may choose to provide their own safety glasses or use those available at WaFAC. All students are required to adhere to the Dye Studio Safety Precautions.

Mordanting


